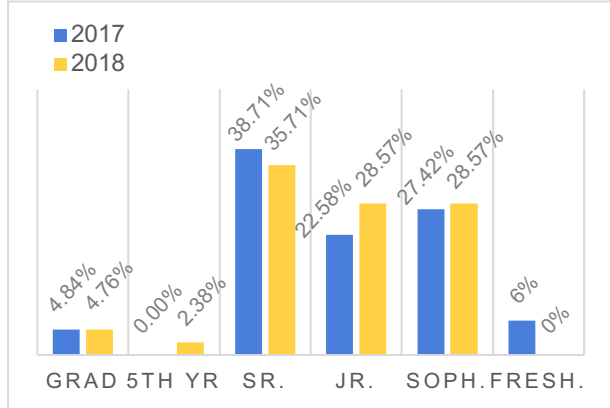


STUDENTS RISING ABOVE 2018 Internship Survey One-Page Summary

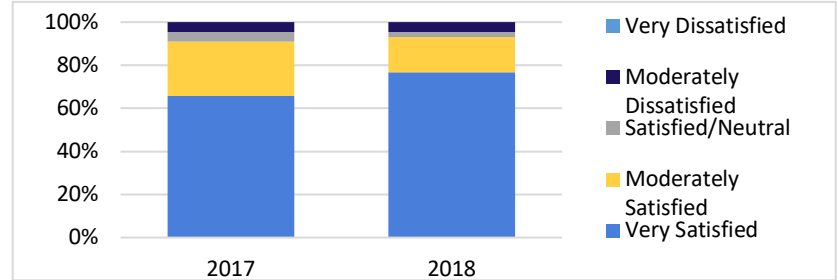
Current Year of Matriculation (2017 vs. 2018)

Note: students reported anticipated college level for the following fall (i.e. "sophomores" are rising sophomores)



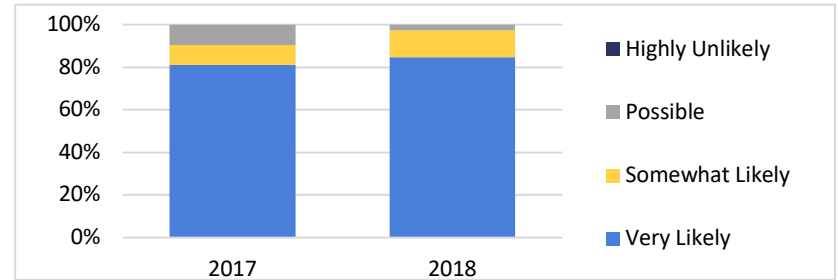
Student Overall Satisfaction of Experience 2017 vs. 2018

This corresponds to the answers addressing the statement, "Overall Satisfaction of your internship".

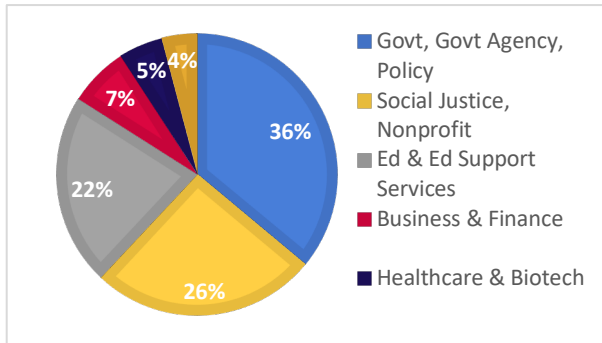


Employer Overall Satisfaction of Experience 2017 vs. 2018
