### **SOAR: The Results Are In!**

In 2018, SRA created the Students Online Achieving Results (SOAR) program to support even more students in pursuing postsecondary education and obtaining careerladder jobs. SOAR connects scholars from low-income backgrounds with an SRA advisor, a peer mentor, and a small cohort of peers in a supportive online community. The program provides scholars with one-on-one advising,

curriculum-based advising sessions (called hangouts), and real-world problem solving to increase college persistence and graduation rates.



In the spring partnered

with the University of California-Riverside's School of Education to study the SOAR program's effects. Just some of the results:

This year marks five years since SRA's first scholars enrolled in the SOAR program, and - drum roll, please more than 70% have graduated from college. This is nearly six times\* the national average for students from low-income backgrounds.

Now, SOAR is expanding its services and growing to serve more students. While 106 scholars were supported through three SOAR programs during the 2021-2022 school year, 243 scholars are participating across five SOAR programs this school year. SOAR scholars are enrolled at 95 different colleges and universities, with the biggest representation here in California. There are 22 SOAR scholars attending UC Berkeley and 20 scholars attending UC Davis, and our Peer Mentor Internship program has also grown from 10 peer mentors to 17 peer mentors.

## **New Grad Mentor Program**


The transition from college to the workforce can be daunting. The New Grad Mentor Program is an 8-12 month program designed to provide college seniors and new college graduates an opportunity to connect with a professional in their field of interest. New Grad Mentors-30% of whom are SRA alumni-assist and guide new graduates during their

transition into their post-graduate life. Students in this program receive oneon-one mentoring and networking assistance from their assigned New Grad Mentor, who can help answer career or professional life questions. There are currently 60 participants in the program since its debut in October 2022.
